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## Summary

DFW recorded a **net gain** of **20,700 jobs** in March, giving a **total workforce** of **4,019,800** for the region. From the previous month, **unemployment rates** across DFW, Texas, and the United States all saw **decreases**. The largest relative growth in employment numbers from the previous month was in **construction**, which saw an increase by **2.3%** and the largest total growth went to **education and health services** with an increase of **6,500 employees**. From March of 2021, **all industries** have seen **increases** in the number of employees.

For the top job postings, **software developers** saw a **decrease** in the number of postings from the previous month by **-10.1%**, despite still being number one overall. The second largest posting, **registered nurses**, had an **increase** from February by **10.4%**.

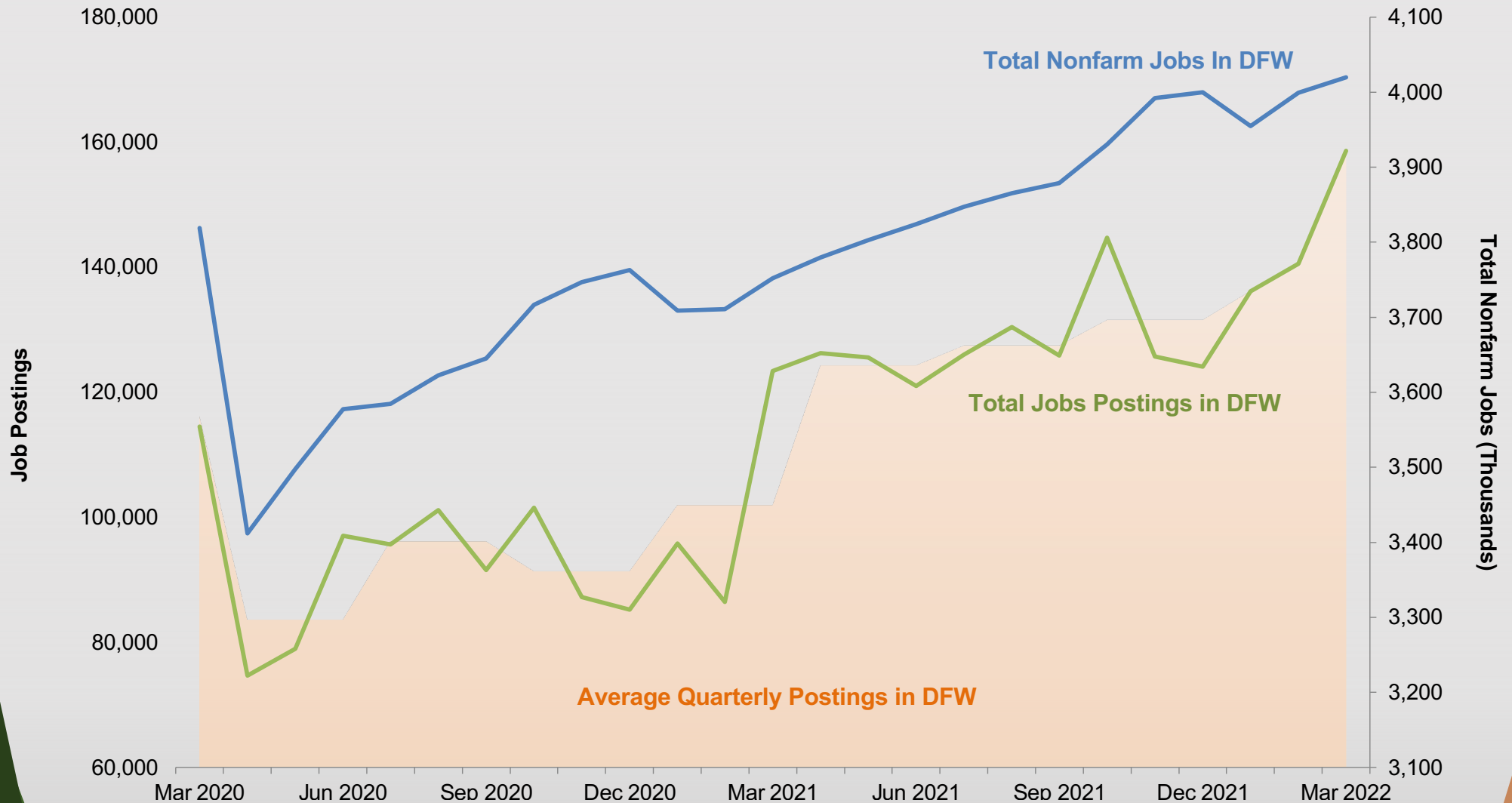
**Psychiatrists** were one of the fastest growing **job postings** from the previous month, with a change of **209.1%**, or **115 unique postings**. **Short order cooks, food preparation workers, bakers, and hosts and hostesses** also saw some of the highest month-over-month growth in March. **Elementary school teachers** saw nearly **double the postings** from February and will likely continue to increase as the school year comes to an end.

March marks the release of new **metro-level CPI** data for DFW and confirms that prices in North Texas are indeed experiencing a **major rise** from the previous estimate in January. The monthly data for all other relevant geographies show similar growth.

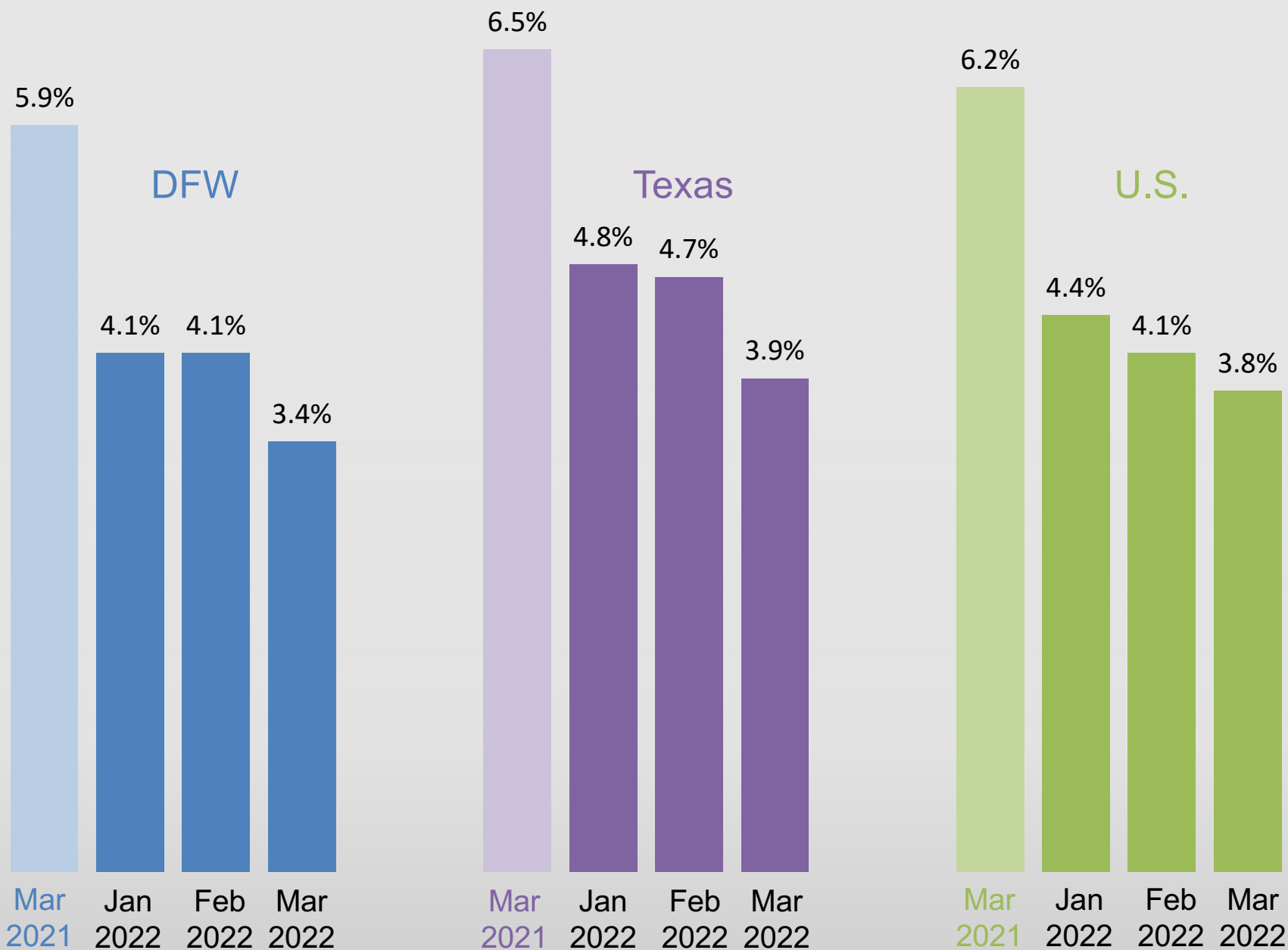


# DFW – Job Postings vs. Nonfarm Jobs

# Unemployment Rates\* in DFW, Texas, and U.S.



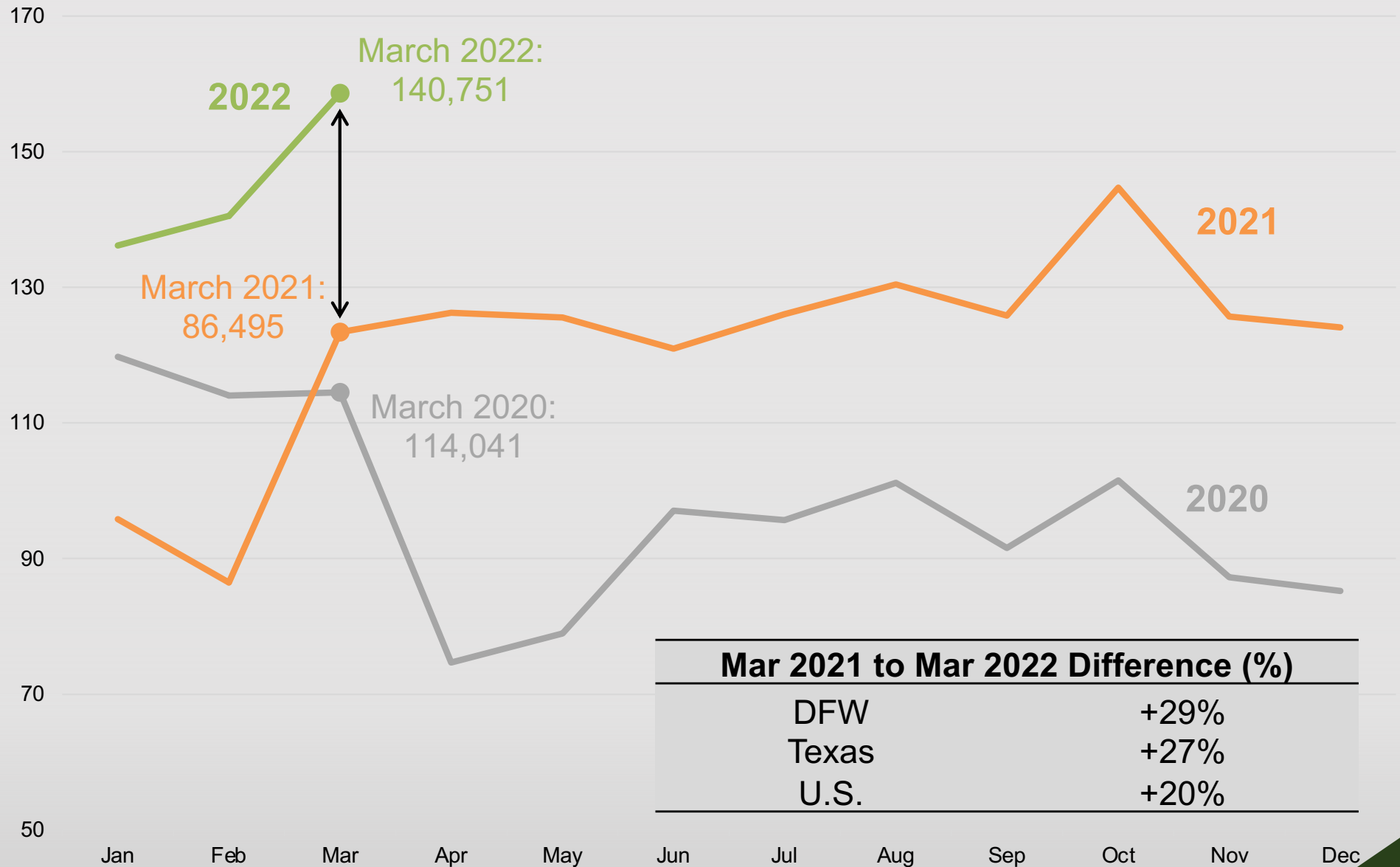

Job postings, thousands



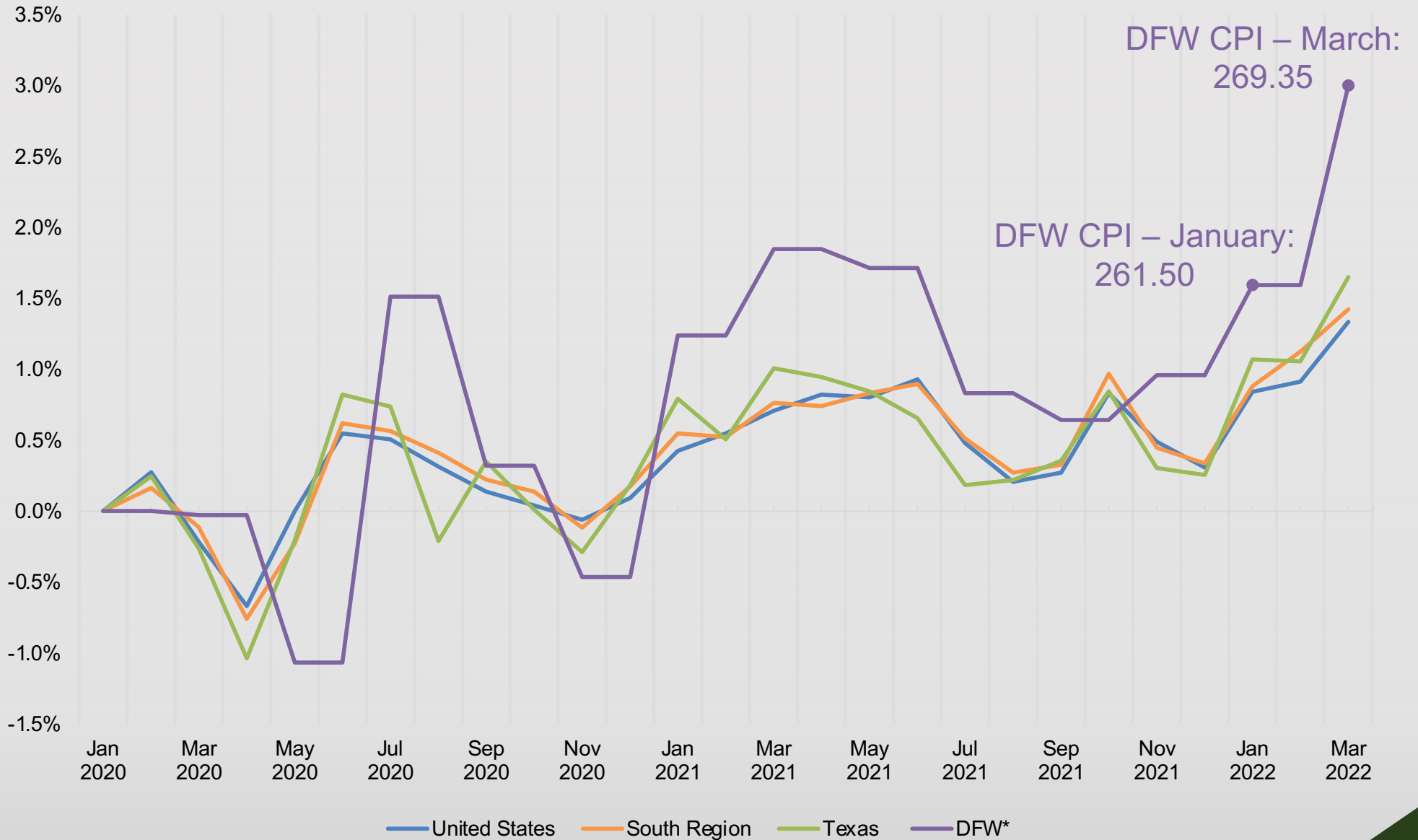
