

# DFW LABOR MARKET UPDATE JULY 2023

#### SUMMARY


There was a **rise** in employment this July with **4,300** jobs added to the local labor market. Leading this month-over-month growth were the professional and business service and construction sectors. Opposing this trend were the government and leisure and hospitality sectors, which collectively experienced the largest drops in employment since June. The local unemployment rate increased slightly by **0.2%** but is still **below** Texas' rate of **4.5%**.

In terms of labor demand, the market continues to show signs of **slight decline**, with local postings down 7.8% since the previous month. Topping the fastest-growing occupations postings list, automotive attendants and carpenters experienced some of the biggest relative gains in unique openings this July. Contrasting this, software assurance analysts and civil engineers saw the largest declines, with their number of openings falling by 36.1% and 27.2%, respectively. The professions with the highest overall level of unique postings, registered nurses and software developers, both experienced continued declines from their peaks from last year. Overall, postings for July 2023 were down **37.8%** compared to last July. This indicates a **relative** slowdown in the demand for new workers in the region.

The CPI data for this month indicates that all evaluated geographies in our report have experienced near zero growth in overall prices since the previous observation point. Compared to July of 2022, which had seen an increase from 1.02% since May, the current change of **0.30%** during the same period in 2023 is a significant development for the DFW metropolitan area.


# **DFW – Job Postings vs. Nonfarm Jobs**


#### **Unemployment Rates\* in DFW, Texas, and U.S.**





### **DFW Total Job Postings Over the Years**


