

DFW LABOR MARKET UPDATE JANUARY 2024

SUMMARY

From December to January, the DFW labor market lost **73,000** jobs, or **1.7%** of its labor force. Primary gains in employment were felt most in the **other services** sector which grew by **0.9%**, adding 1,300 jobs. In contrast, professional and business services finished with 18,900 fewer positions, followed by wholesale and retail trade, which experienced a month-over-month decline of 15,100 jobs. In terms of annual changes DFW started the year off with 74,600 more jobs than in January of 2023 – with the **public** sector leading this trend by contributing **17,900** more jobs than it did in January of last year.


The unemployment rate in January also increased, with DFW's rate going up from 3.3% to 3.9%. The state and national labor markets followed this trend, with **both** the Texas and national unemployment rates moving up from 3.5% to 4.1% according to the latest figures.

Total job postings saw a month-over-month increase of **24.6%** in January. The top posted job during the month was **registered nurse** with 3,712 unique postings, followed by **software** developer, with saw 1,460 more postings added since December. In terms of fastest growing occupations, preschool teachers took the lead with 250 new jobs and a 69.8% month-overmonth increase. In contrast, the fastest shrinking occupation was automotive service attendant which saw a 77.1% decline during the same time-period.

The CPI data for DFW in January points towards an overall decrease in price changes since the last observation in November, with the local inflation rate falling from **0.88%** to **0.86%**. However, the Texas, Southern region, and national economies saw slight increases in each of their inflation rates. Rising from 0.001% to 0.76%, -0.059% to 0.56% and from -0.01% to 0.54%, respectively.



DFW – Job Postings vs. Nonfarm Jobs





Unemployment Rates* in DFW, Texas, and U.S.






DFW Total Job Postings Over the Years
