


DFW's Future Freshmen: How UT Dallas Can Capitalize on Local Students More than **87,500** seniors graduated from public high schools in the Dallas-Fort Worth area in 2018. Approximately **1,800** became Comets at UT Dallas the following August, comprising just under half of the **3,961** freshmen enrolled in Fall 2018.


The following slides will explore the geographic distribution of DFW-area seniors who chose UT Dallas.



UT Dallas made tremendous gains between 2010 and 2018 in recruitment of local students. The core area of school districts that reached the threshold of at least five graduates who became UT Dallas freshmen expanded to cover most of Collin, Dallas, Denton, Rockwall, and Tarrant counties, and even reach into Ellis, Kaufman, and Wise counties.

Meanwhile, top school districts for UT Dallas freshmen contributed up to **nine times as many students** in 2018 compared to 2010.









Source: Texas Higher Education Board, 2020 Note: List excludes charter high school districts. Percentage-wise, the story is equally impressive. Not only the number, but also the share of graduates who matriculated at UT Dallas increased across DFW school districts.

Plano ISD contributed 371 students in 2018, or just under 10 percent of its graduating class, up from 6 percent in 2010. Frisco ISD saw similar growth, from 2 percent of its 2010 class to 7 percent of its 2018 class.

The gains in enrollment by graduates from school districts across the map indicate that word about UT Dallas is spreading – and that former future freshmen are saying good things.
