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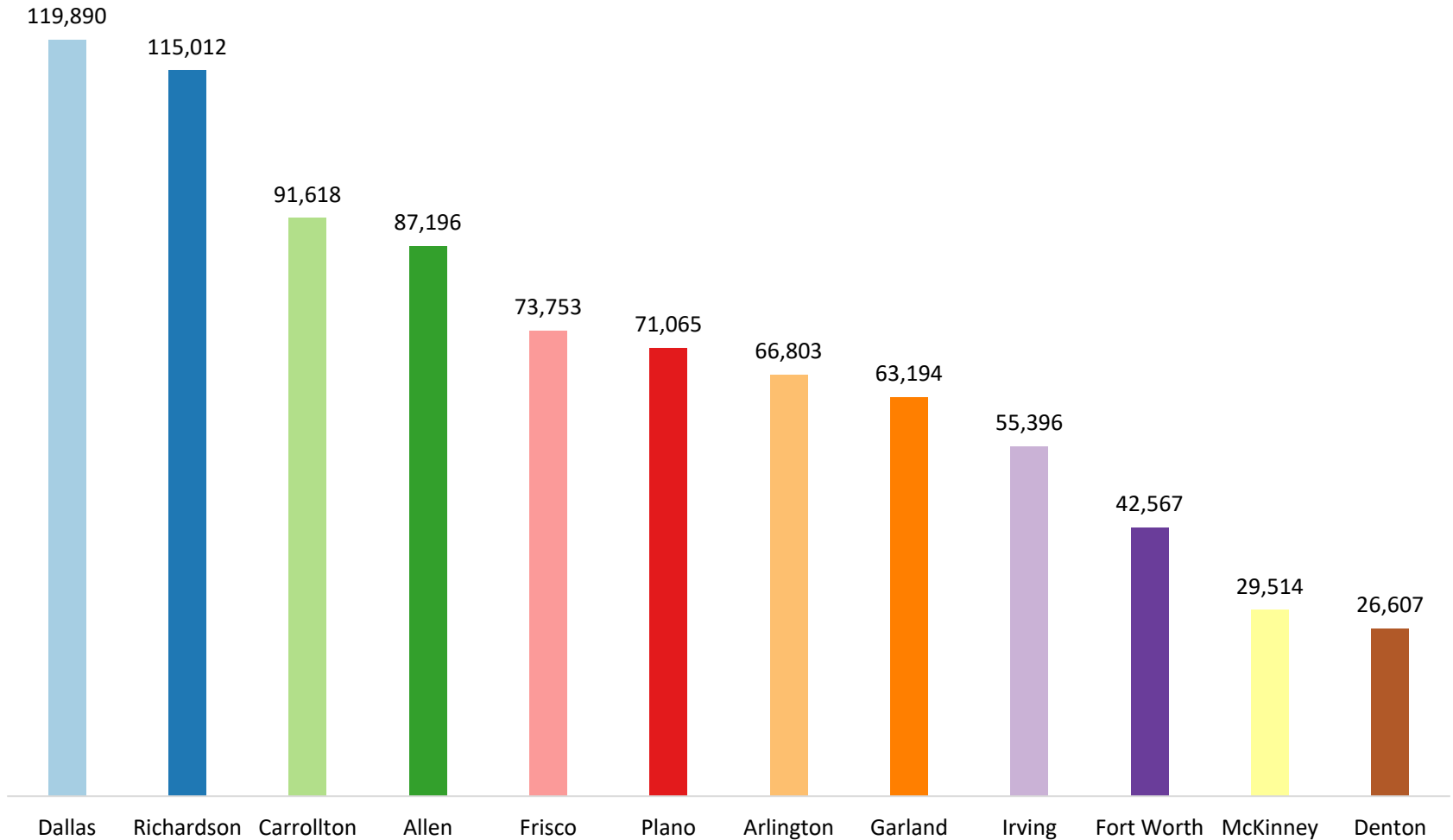

# # of Professional Workers Residing Within a 15-Minute Drive to Major DFW Cities

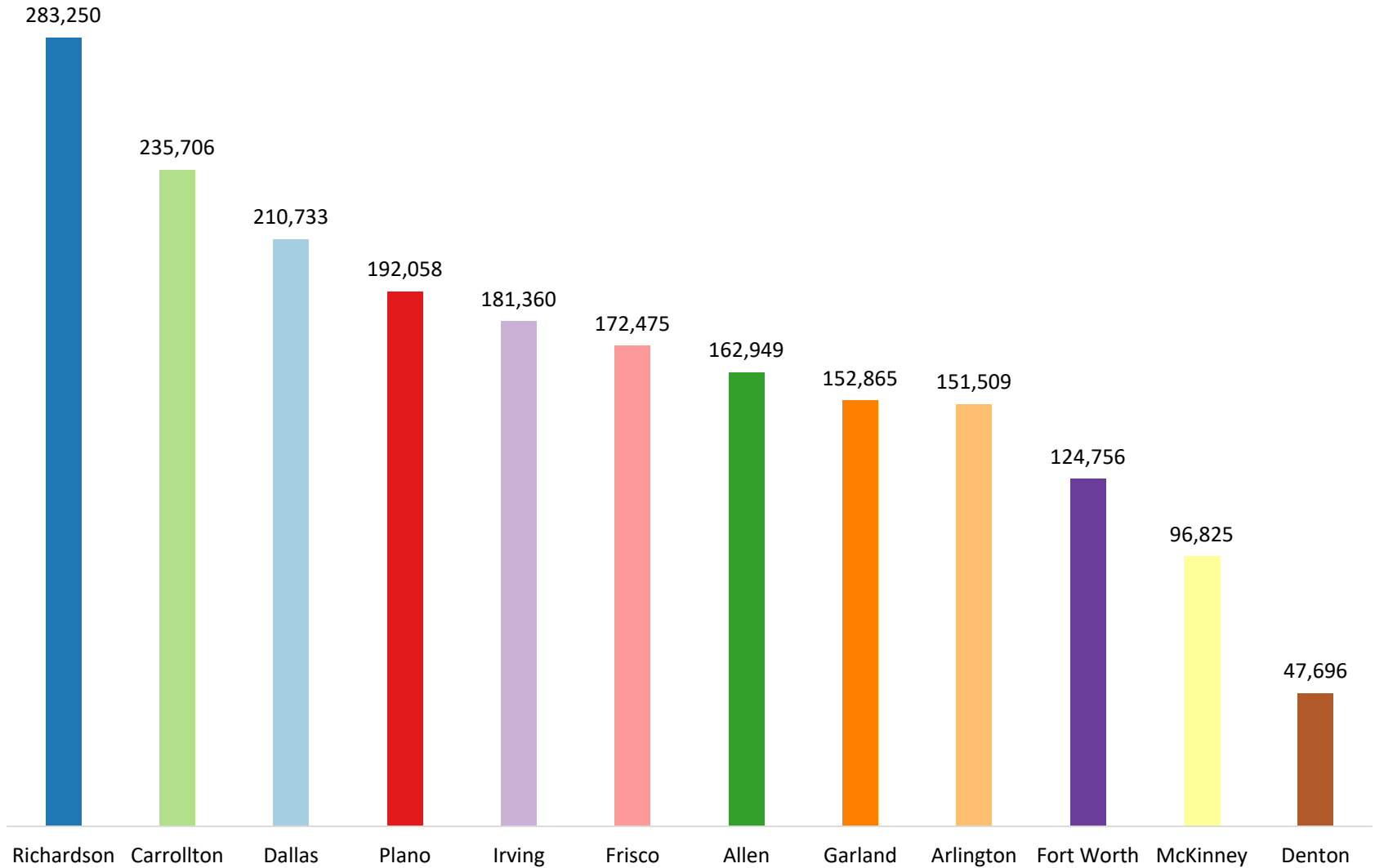

# # of Professional Workers Residing Within a 20-Minute Drive to Major DFW Cities

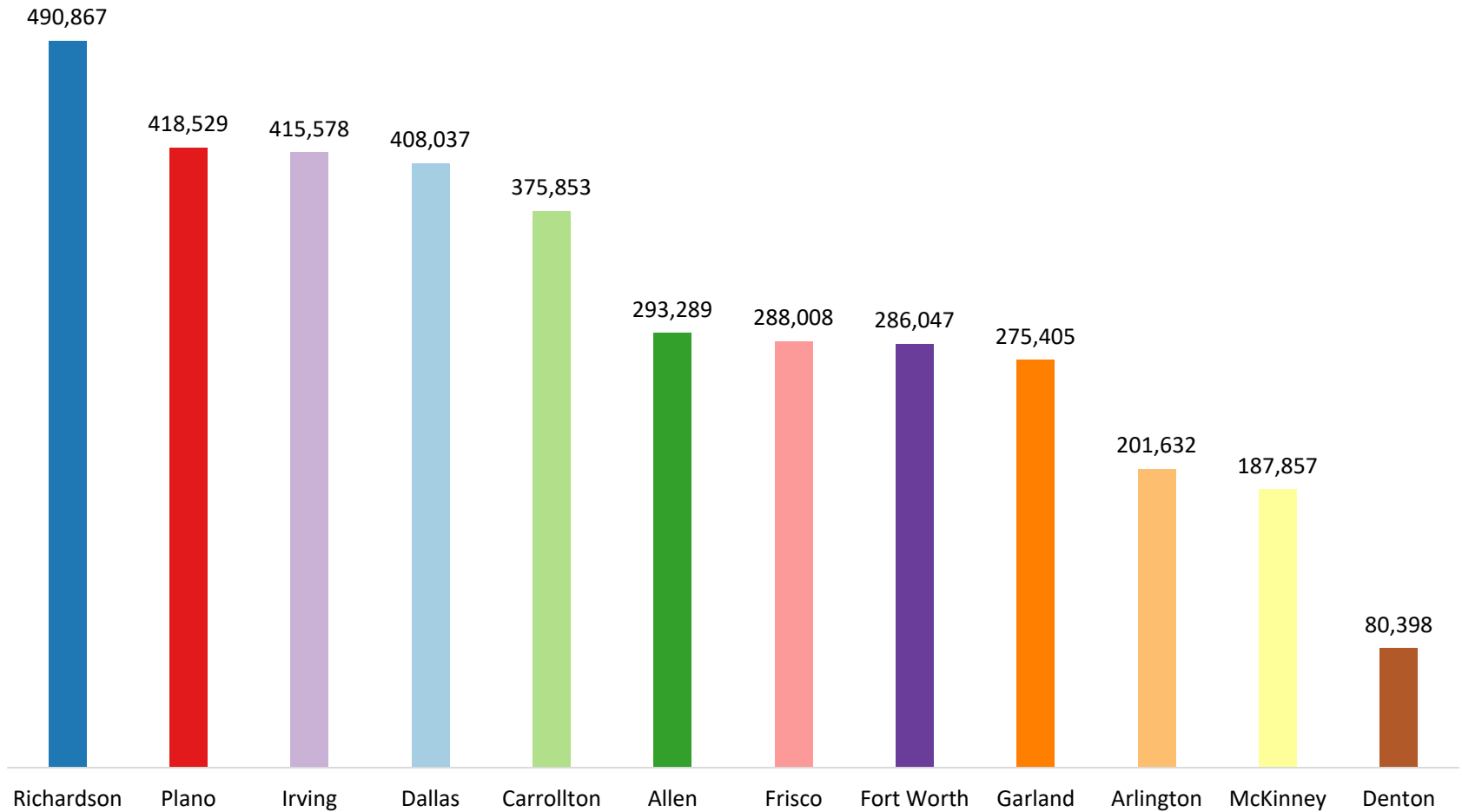

# # of Professional Workers Residing Within a 25-Minute Drive to Major DFW Cities

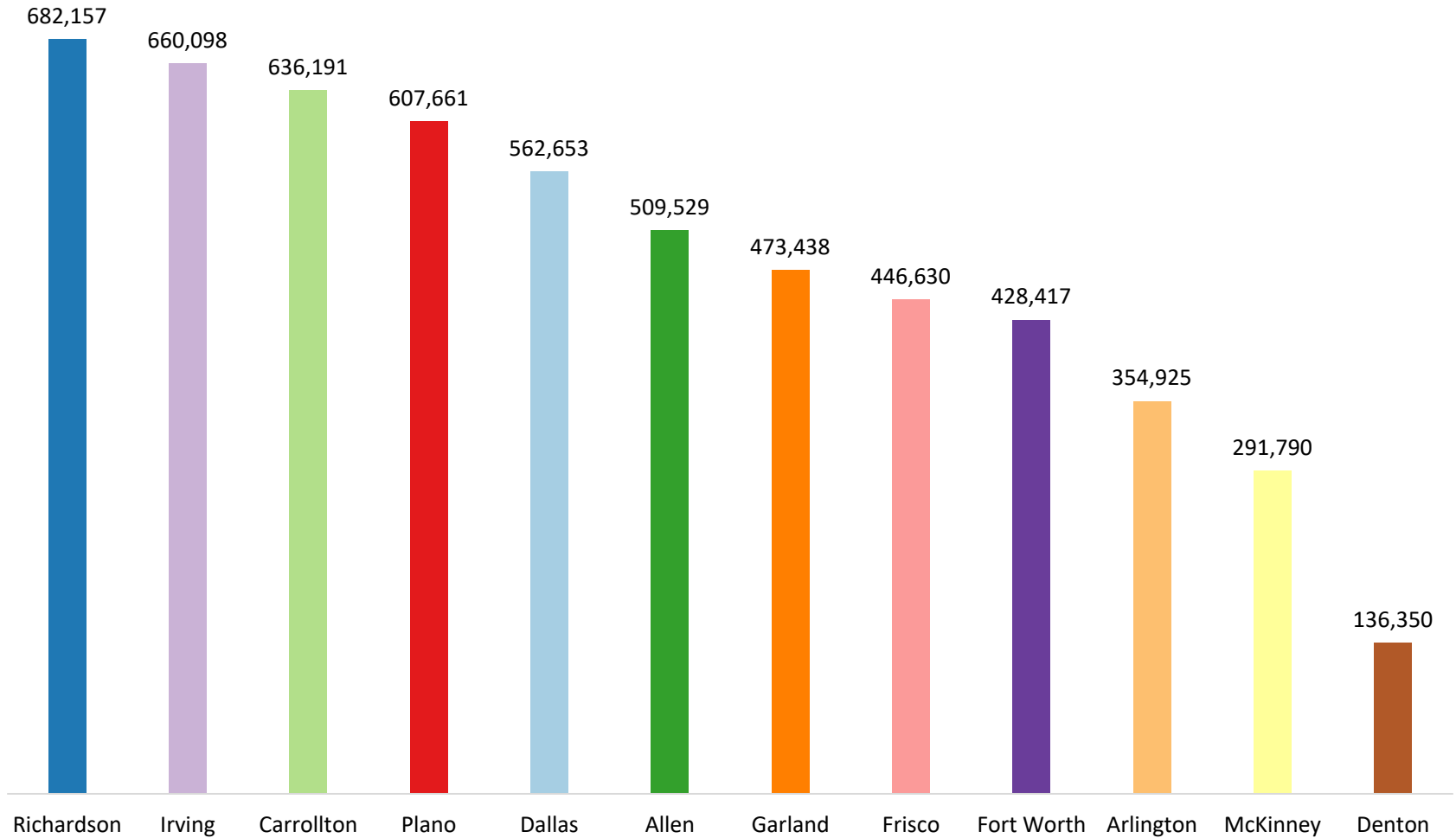

# # of Professional Workers Residing Within a 30-Minute Drive to Major DFW Cities

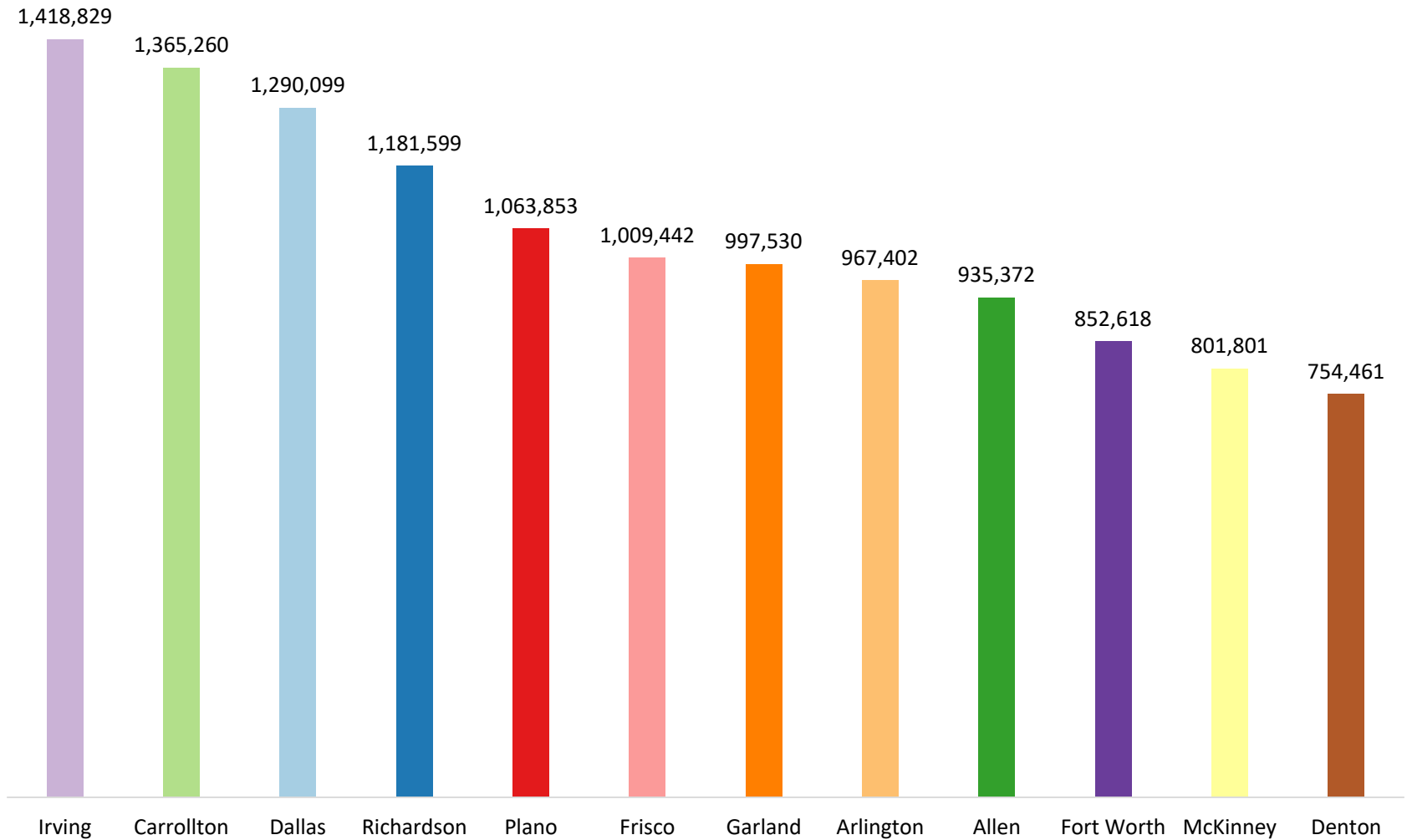

# # of Professional Workers Residing Within a 45-Minute Drive to Major DFW Cities

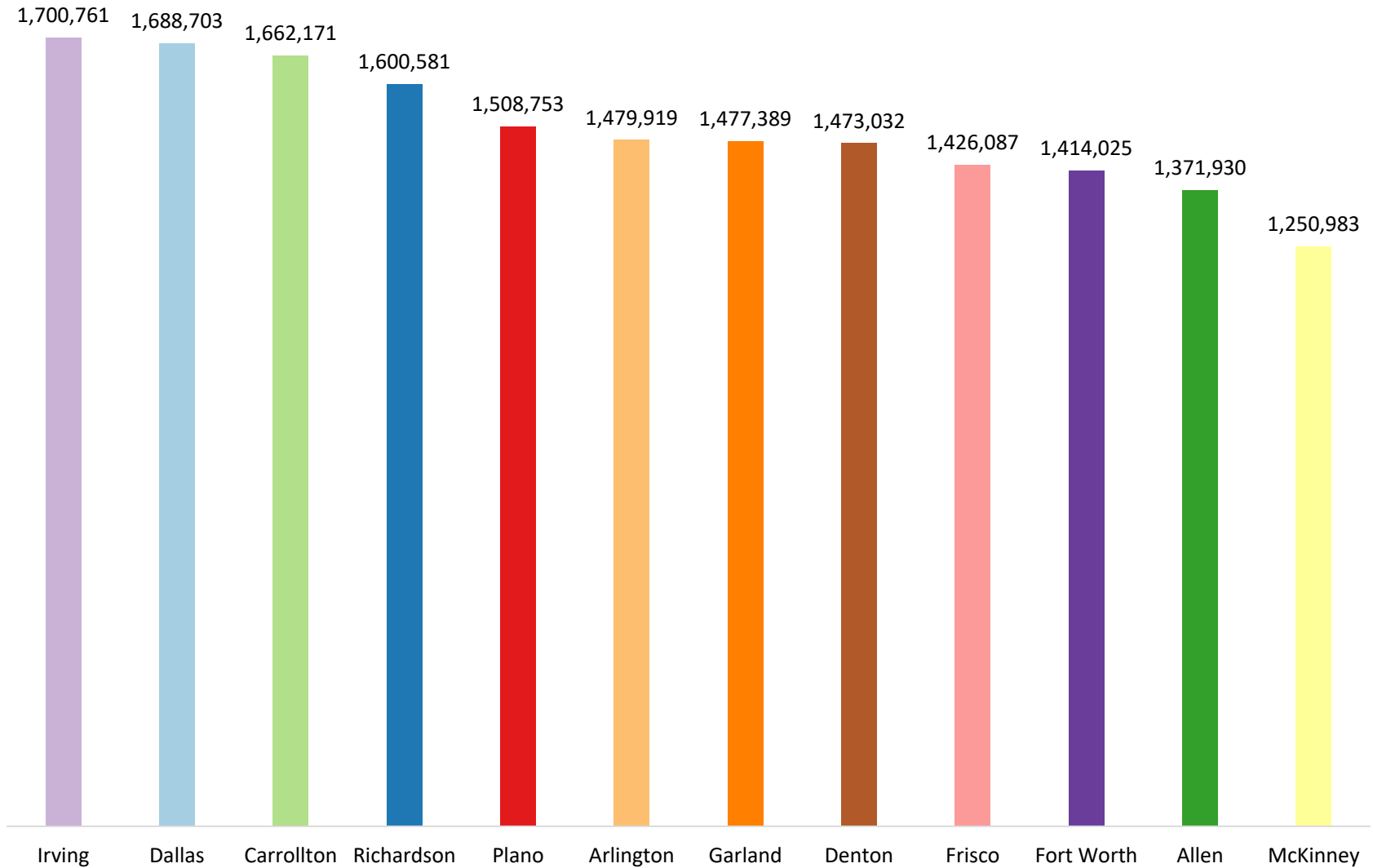
