



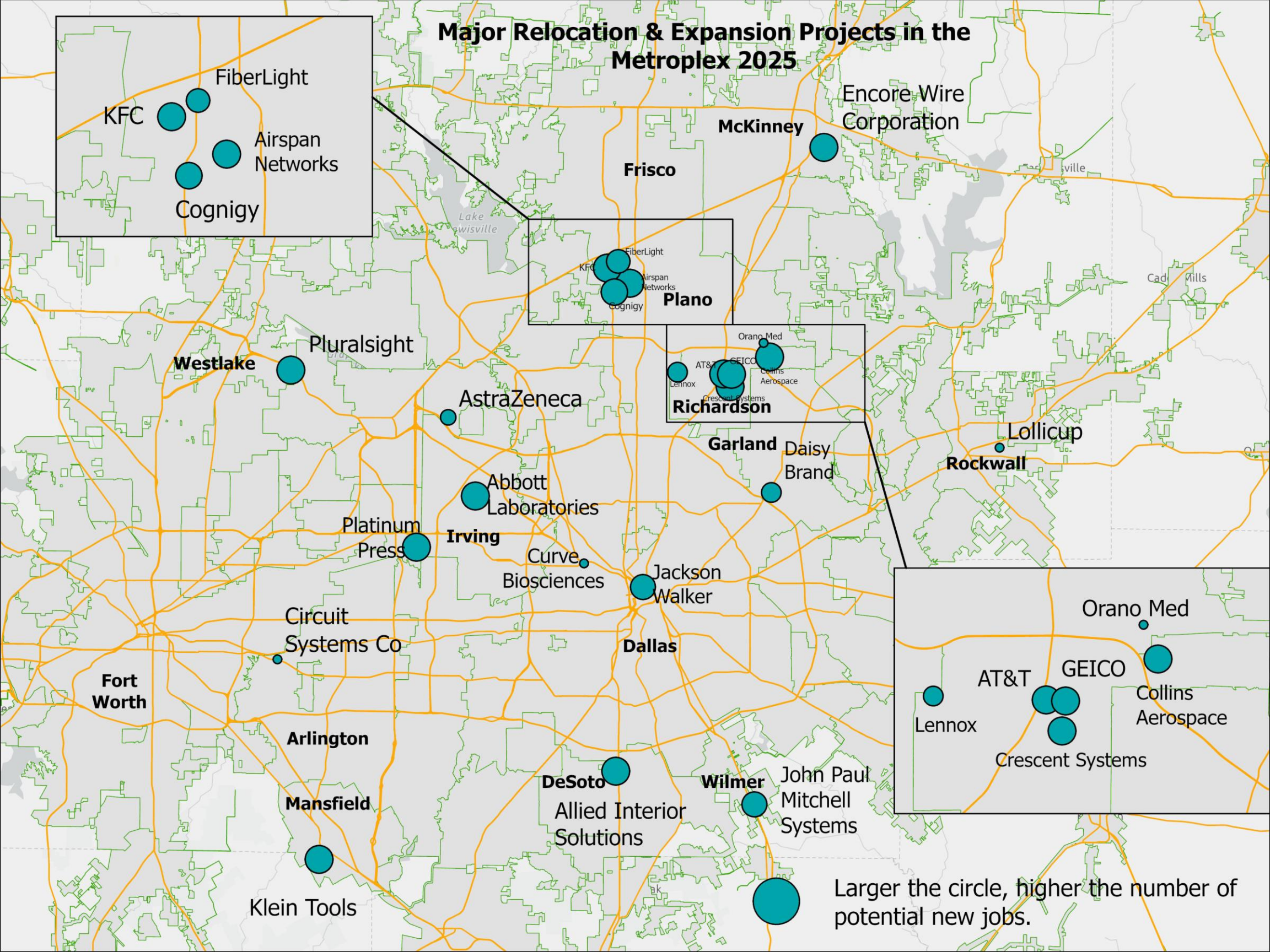

# Major Relocation & Expansion Projects in the Metroplex 2025



Abbott Laboratories, a global health care leader, is expanding its U.S. manufacturing footprint with a \$500 million investment in facilities in Illinois and Dallas. The company also expects to create approximately 100 new jobs over the next few years at its Irving location as part of this expansion.



Airspan Networks, a global wireless network solutions provider, has relocated its corporate headquarters from Florida to Plano. The new headquarters is expected to employ more than 150 people across engineering, customer support, sales, and corporate functions, and will serve as a hub for global collaboration and solution development.

Allied Interior Solutions Inc. is expanding its manufacturing facility in DeSoto to 454,408 square feet through a \$22 million investment, creating more than 190 new jobs. The expansion will position the company among the largest employers in the city.



AstraZeneca, one of the world's leading pharmaceutical companies, is expanding its Coppell manufacturing facility by 9,000 square feet with a \$445 million investment. The project will add 30 new jobs to its existing 250-person workforce. The Coppell site is the sole manufacturing plant for Lokelma, a drug used to treat hyperkalemia, and the expansion will double the medication's production capacity.

AT&T, the nation's leading telecommunications company, is expanding its Richardson campus. The new facility will add 1,000 new jobs to its existing 400 employee workforce.



Circuit Systems, a family-owned aerospace products manufacturer, is expanding its Arlington facility by 23,000 square feet. The expansion will support increased production capacity and strengthen the company's role in the region's growing aerospace supply chain.

Cognigy, an artificial intelligence chatbot company, has relocated its U.S. headquarters from San Francisco to Plano, occupying 5,000 square feet and creating 40 new jobs with plans for future growth. It was recently acquired by NiCE in a \$955 million deal, shortly after its move to Plano.



Collins Aerospace, a leading aerospace firm, is expanding its Richardson facility with a \$57 million investment. The project will create more than 570 new jobs and strengthen the company's presence in the region's growing aerospace sector.

Crescent Systems, a Richardson-based defense and aerospace manufacturer, has committed to long-term leases for its current facility and is expanding into an additional 14,000 square feet. The expansion will create 36 new high-paying jobs, adding to the company's existing workforce of 113 employees.



Curve Biosciences, a biotechnology startup focused on diagnosing chronic diseases through DNA analysis, has relocated its headquarters from Silicon Valley to BioLabs at Pegasus Park in Dallas.



Daisy Brand, a sour cream and cottage cheese producer, is opening a 56,000 square feet research and innovation center at its Garland facility. The \$24 million investment will increase the size of the current team and support expanded product development capabilities.

Encore Wire, a leading manufacturer of electrical wire and cable for residential, commercial, and industrial projects, is expanding its facility by 650,000 square feet with a \$500 million investment. The expansion will create an additional 120 jobs and enhance the company's production capacity.



FiberLight, a leader in high-capacity fiber optic networks, has relocated its corporate headquarters from Georgia to Plano, creating 65 jobs. The move positions the company at the center of the region's rapidly growing AI and data center ecosystem.

GEICO is expanding rapidly at its Richardson campus, opening a new 165,000-square-foot building with plans to add 1,000 jobs across sales, service, and claims.



Jackson Walker, one of the largest law firms in Texas, is expanding its headquarters at KPMG Plaza in the Dallas Arts District and is expected to create up to 80 new jobs.

John Paul Mitchell Systems, a leading haircare products manufacturer, is relocating its corporate headquarters from San Francisco to Wilmer. The company is investing \$12 million on a new global product distribution center with the potential to create 80 new jobs.

KFC is relocating its corporate headquarters from Kentucky, to Plano, bringing 100 corporate jobs. The move supports Yum! Brands' strategy to strengthen collaboration among its restaurant brands.



Klein Tools, a family-owned tool company, is expanding its Mansfield campus through a \$100 million investment. The project includes a new global research and development headquarters and warehouse, and is expected to create 400 high-paying jobs over the next decade.

Lennox, a leading residential and commercial HVAC company, is expanding its Richardson headquarters to include a new R&D Innovation Center. The expansion will add 45,000 square feet and is expected to create 45 new jobs.

Lollicup USA has relocated its corporate headquarters from California, to its existing Rockwall location. The move is intended to improve customer service and enhance efficiency between its manufacturing, operations and distribution teams.



Orano Med has expanded its Plano R&D center by 11,000 square feet through a \$5 million investment. The facility focuses on developing novel radiopharmaceuticals and conducting preclinical cancer research.

Platinum Press, a provider of printed packaging solutions, is expanding its Fort Worth headquarters by 70,000 square feet to a total of 220,000 square feet. The \$15 million expansion is expected to add up to 300 jobs.



Pluralsight, a leading technology skills education company, is relocating its corporate headquarters from Utah to Westlake. The company will occupy 18,000 square feet, and potentially create 150 jobs, leveraging North Texas' tech talent pool, business-friendly environment, and central geographic location.
